


"Love, Life and Logic" by Uday Mukerji

Rohan is thirty-six, divorced and drifting in a career he no longer cares for. He has done everything expected of him and ticked all the boxes - He married a beautiful woman, has two healthy children, a great career as a high-flyer in finance, property in Singapore and Phuket, financial security, and yet he feels a gaping hole in his life.

In order to clear his head, Rohan travels to Europe, New Zealand, Phuket and finally to his childhood home in India, where, with help along the way from an old family friend, and a potential new romantic interest, he sets his life back on course.

This is a surprising and delightful voyage of discovery that is easy to relate to. It is well written and a joy to read. It makes a wonderful read for anyone thinking about their direction in life, but is light enough to make a good holiday read.

A quick interview with the author:

What was your inspiration to write "Love, Life, and Logic"?

The inspiration to write *Love, Life, and Logic* comes from the few crucial questions inherent in all of us. However busy we get in life, every once in a while, we ask ourselves: Who am I and what is my role in this eternal odyssey? What most people secretly think and would much hesitate to talk about, this book brings out some of those intricate, inner-most thoughts out in the open.

More than seven billion people today are asking the same question, but guess what, it has more than seven billion answers, because no two people experience life in the same way. Everyone's purpose in life is different, and so is their realization. *Love, Life, and Logic* chases only one such answer – how one person makes sense of everything happening around him and how he interprets the purpose of his existence in this eternal process.

Call it a self-introspection or a quest, but I guess, we all deserve to get our own answers. Don't we all owe it to ourselves?

Is the character of Rohan based on someone you know?

The protagonist's character here isn't based on any particular individual, rather it's a desperate cry - an inner voice of many individuals I met over the years. Some of those relationships developed into close friendships, and some of them remained just as casual acquaintances.

Are you planning on writing another novel?

Yes, I have recently finished my second novel and I am on to my third one now: it's about one person's fight against genetic diseases.

What do you enjoy reading?

I love reading classics. Who knows, maybe I secretly follow Marcel Proust's advice: "The wisest thing is to stick with dead authors." The thing about these classics is, they don't end when you're finished reading; they live within you and grow with you. Some of my favourite authors are Jane Austen, Charlotte Bronte, Stendhal, Dostoevsky, Kafka, Camus, and Milan Kundera, not in any particular order, though.
